

# Building Campaign: Purchase a Paver to Pave the Courtyard and Provide Storage!

The need for storage space is desperate—even some museum spaces are crammed with chairs, tables, and other supplies. Because the courtyard is heavily used at events, the grassy areas are dirt most of the year.

Purchase a paver and help raise the roof of a new storage building and pave the courtyard. Until March 31, the price per brick is \$50. On April 1, the cost will go to \$60. You may have your paver engraved to commemorate an event or honor or remember a person. Details are on the form on page 3.
